Open Letter from Our HOA Board of Directors

Recently, the public boat ramp on Enterprise Osteen Road was closed by the county, and reportedly will be closed for a 12-month period. As of late, our boat launch area has been flooded with non-resident boaters, creating parking and launch access problems for our residents and their guests who use this great amenity. It has been a longstanding practice that our community uses specific Stone Island stickers for residents to display on their trailer, or inside of their vehicle, identifying them as a Stone Island resident. For the past year, vehicles that were found to be parked at the boat ramp without a sticker were issued written warnings to help provide notice that this is a private boat ramp and not open to the public. Approximately one year ago, in response to numerous complaints about non-residents' use, the HOA installed signs at the boat ramp and at the entrance to our community on Stone Island Road to prevent people who do not live on Stone Island from using our boat ramp. These signs are to warn non-residents that they are on private property, and that if these individuals are found trespassing to use the launch, are not residents of this Island, or their invited guests, their vehicle and trailer will be subject to tow.

To protect our residents and their guests from not only being able to use the boat ramp, but also potential legal risk and liability to every homeowner, we will be enforcing the rules posted at the boat launch. **Effective Monday February 28, 2022, any vehicle parked at the boat ramp that does not have a Stone Island sticker clearly displayed on it, or inside of it, will be towed to C&S Towing in Orange City.** The signs erected at the entrance of the boat ramp, as well as at the entrance to our community on Stone Island Road have the contact information for C&S towing on the signs. If you, or anyone you know that uses the boat ramp who lives on Stone Island needs a sticker for you or a guest, please contact a HOA board member so we can provide you with one.
